PROFILE

Overview

The Aga Khan Schools (AKS), an agency of the Aga Khan Development Network (AKDN), comprises the Aga Khan Education Services (AKES) and the Aga Khan Academies (AKA). AKS is a network of 200 schools, over 100 non-formal education programme centres and eight hostels, serving more than 110,000 students each year, with the support of over 6,500 teachers and staff. The agency currently operates across 12 countries in East Africa, the Middle East and South and Central Asia.

Curriculum


AKS operates seven International Baccalaureate (IB) World Schools for students aged 3 to 18. The schools are located in:


- Dar es Salaam, Tanzania;

- Nairobi, Kenya.


The Academies' programme additionally emphasises five cross-curricular themes known as the Aga Khan Curricular Strands: Ethics; Pluralism; Cultures; Governance and Civil Society; and Economics for Development. These themes provide a framework for developing students as ethical, pluralistic leaders who create positive change in their communities.
